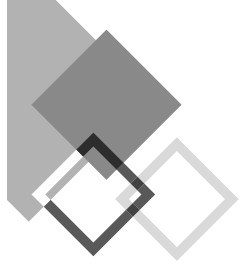

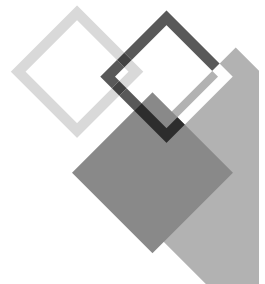

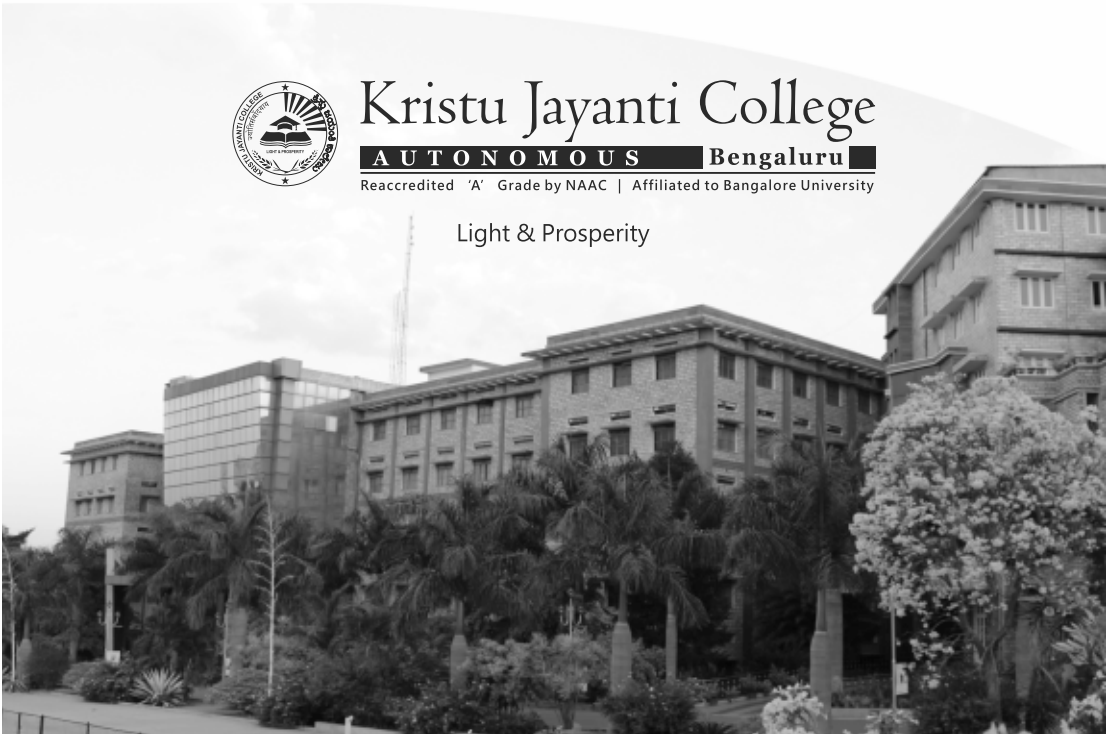

Kristu Jayanti College is an incarnation of the educational dreams of Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara (1805-1871), the founder of the religious congregation, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI). He envisioned the sunrise of a renewed humanity through the integral development of mind, body and spirit. The motto of the college, 'Light and Prosperity', aims at this synthesis and the harmony of the spiritual, the physical, the mind and the body. A healthy environment for the acquisition, promotion and dissemination of knowledge, is provided here with the aspirations of growing into an academic fraternity joining hands for the development and progress of humanity at large. The curriculum and the co-curricular activities are the basic structures acting as springboards to step into the mystery of human life and beyond. The very name, Kristu Jayanti, as the college was started in Anno Domini 1999, is the commemoration of the two millennia of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who invites each of us to dream and to reach the perfection of the heavenly father, God himself: "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mathew 5:48).

The college is affiliated to Bangalore University and is reaccredited with highest grade 'A' by NAAC in Second Cycle of Accreditation. The college is recognized by UGC under the category 2(f) & 12(B). The college was accorded autonomous status from 2013 by the University Grants Commission, Government of Karnataka & the Bangalore University. In India Today - Nielsen survey (2017), the college is ranked 2nd Best BCA College, 9th best Commerce College, 14th best Arts College & 17th best Science College in India and second, third and fourth positions in Arts, Commerce & Science among Top 10 Colleges in Bangalore.

The Campus

Kristu Jayanti College is affiliated to Bangalore University, the largest University in the country. The college is located in a calm and serene campus at K. Narayanapura in Bangalore, 11 kms away from Vidhana Soudha, the heart of Bangalore City. Housed in a spacious campus, the college incorporates a traditional academic setting with cutting edge technology.

The institution invests heavily on infrastructure to keep pace with the changing needs and profile of the student population. To catch up with the scientific and technological advancements, parallel upgradation of facilities in the form of laboratories, library and other learning resources namely computers, e-resources and Wi-Fi facility is carried on as an ongoing activity. Physical facilities have been expanded to create an ambience conducive for academic excellence and holistic development. Various departments and administrative sections are housed in the Main Block. The MBA and MCA programmes function in a separate block. The college provides spacious class rooms, auditoria, laboratories, conference halls, panel rooms and sports facilities. Besides, IT centre, bioscience laboratories, electronics lab, psychology lab, commerce lab, language lab and media lab integrate technology effectively into the teaching learning process.

Training Methodology

The training methodology of the college aims to equip young minds with a global outlook to face the challenges of tomorrow and at the same time ensure that they are guided by a set of values and beliefs that reflect the Indian ethos. The management, staff and the very atmosphere itself are geared to attain this goal. This is achieved through an all-round development of the intellectual, social, physical and spiritual spheres of life.

The teaching-learning process evolved in the institution is 'learner centric' to fulfill the dreams and aspirations of the students joining this college. In this process various methods like class room lecture, problem solving, group discussion, role play, case study, panel discussions, experimentation in the laboratories, seminars and conferences enable students to excel in academics. Experiential learning through project work, internships and industrial visits is an integral part of the process. A wide array of teaching aids such as charts, maps, models, power point presentations, multimedia presentations and posters are used to facilitate innovative teaching. Informal interaction with students and counseling help the teachers to understand them better and to help in their positive development. All the departments practice academic and personal mentoring. Class room learning is supplemented by interactions in the seminars, workshops, conferences and MDPs. The institution is equipped with state of the art IT facilities to integrate information technology in its teaching learning process.

In a competitive environment the students and faculty keep abreast with the latest developments in their subjects, utilizing the sources available in college such as internet, e-resources, books, journals, interactive CDs, conferences, symposia, panel discussions, seminars, workshops, MDPs, expert lectures, Faculty Development Programmes and Current Affairs Forum.

Prayer and Holistic Development

A socially responsible citizen has a morally righteous mind. At Kristu Jayanti College, we ensure that the students are morally educated. Further more, recognising the value of prayer and meditation, due importance is given to techniques of concentration and personal prayer. One hour every week is set aside for prayer and reflection. Eucharistic Liturgy is celebrated every First Friday of the month for Catholic students and social outreach programmes are also conducted regularly.

Teaching Fraternity

Jayantian teacher is a facilitator, guide, mentor and leader who creates a suitable learning ambience inside and outside the classroom. The institution nurtures an environment for the growth and retention of the faculty members. The college considers its human resource as a capital investment which needs to be continuously augmented through sustained training and capacity building to perform multiple tasks. Faculty improvement is facilitated through programmes like in-house FDP, department level programmes and participation in FDPs /

Conferences / Seminars hosted by other institutions. The institution encourages the faculty members to participate and undertake research at the institutional, departmental and personal level leading to research degrees.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The IQAC was established in order to raise the institutional standards to higher levels so that the institution makes sustainable improvement in Quality. IQAC acts as an agency for all quality related activities of the institution, establishing procedures and modalities to collect data and information on various aspects of institutional functioning. Centre for Research

Research Centers

Kristu Jayanti College is a launch pad to pursue scholarly knowledge through research. The Research Promotion Cell with two wings under MSW and M.Sc Biotechnology motivates scholars towards the acquisition of a doctoral degree. With several ongoing projects, the research centre is dedicated to erudite leadership and aims to advance the knowledge in the respective fields through scientific discovery, collaborative work, and national and global outreach. The research program is affiliated to Bangalore University and the research centres are actively dedicated in the pursuit of excellence in the respective fields.

IT Centres

Computer labs are designed with state-of-the-art technology and all the major application software in imparting quality education. They are equipped with internet and are kept open beyond office hours to meet students' computing needs. The campus is equipped with wi-fi facility to meet the computing requirements of students anywhere in the campus.

Library & Information Centre

The college library is a gateway to a world of information. The staff and students have unlimited access to a wealth of information found in resources like books, magazines, journals, statistics, encyclopedia, project reports, dissertations, annual reports and the internet. In addition, the library offers spacious seating arrangements and a calm ambience for learning.

The library is automated and enables easy accessibility and optimum usage. The

library also features OPAC facility for easy search, subscription to online journals, wireless router for internet usage and laptop connectivity, reprographics facility, book bank facility for economically backward students, competitive exam material, educational CD's, etc. An annual book fair is organized for the benefit of the students and faculty members.

Media Lab

The media lab is equipped with latest audio-video production equipment to enable students to have hands-on experience in audio-video production. The journalism students get real-world experience in multi-media productions through the offline television channel- Kristu Jayanti College Television and an offline radio channel- Kristu Jayanti Radio.

To be apace with the emerging global village, Kristu Jayanti College has entered in to a memorandum of understanding with various foreign universities like the Appalachian State University of U.S.A., Normandie Business School of France, FHDW University of Germany, Neu-Ulm University of Applied Sciences (HNU) of Germany and Dortmund University, Germany to promote teaching, research, student and faculty exchange. The various advantages of these associations are reciprocal exchange of faculty members and students, hosting short-term study abroad and exchange of publication and collaborative research.

Skill Enhancement Training Centres

Centre for Employability and Corporate Relations (CECR)

Placements at Kristu Jayanti College have always stirred up much interest due to the visit of leading brands from various sectors. Kristu Jayanti College has a very active Student Placement Committee that conducts the recruitment process in a very systematic way. The Centre organizes training session named, GATE. Training makes the students highly committed, dedicated and prepares them to meet the challenges in the Corporate World. The Centre also gives training in different verticals. Every year, through the effort of CECR, students get placed in top multinational companies.

The CECR has a process and set guidelines to make students more serious about the final placement initiatives.

Centre for Civil Services Coaching

Kristu Jayanti Centre for Civil Services Coaching empowers the Civil Service aspirants of the college to take up the preliminary examination. The training session is of 220 hours duration, and it incorporates external expert training in all the major domains of the preliminary examination syllabus. Moreover, the Centre periodically conducts mock test, civil service orientation classes and group discussions.

Centre for NET / SET Training

Most of the candidates join postgraduate courses with an intention to start a career as a teacher. It has become an attractive option due to social respect the profession commands. For recruitment as faculty in universities/colleges/institutions, the candidates are required to clear NET (National Eligibility Test)/SET (State Eligibility Test). NET will be conducted by the UGC once in a year i.e. in the month of November every year. The Centre trains the young aspirants to enhance their teaching and research aptitude.

Centre for Professional Studies

The Centre for Professional Studies was established with the objective of providing value based quality education to the B.Com and BBA students who want to pursue professional courses. It is a platform to prepare for the entry level exams of Company Secretaryship and Chartered Accountancy. The Centre facilitates training to enable students to become members of Professional Bodies – Institute of Chartered Accountant of India (ICAI) and Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI) in the future.

Kristu Jayanti Incubation Centre

Kristu Jayanti Incubation Centre is designed to accelerate the growth and success of budding entrepreneurs through an array of business support resources and services that could include physical space, capital, coaching, common services, and networking connections. It is a unique and highly flexible combination of business development processes, infrastructure and people, designed to nurture new and small businesses by helping them to survive and grow through the difficult and vulnerable early stages of development. The Kristu Jayanti Incubation Centre aims to help the students of the college build a business by providing them with Management Training, Business Plans and prototypes to successfully venture into an enterprise.

Jayantian Language Learning Centre (JLLC)

Kristu Jayanti College opens up a world for a language solution through Jayantian Language Learning Centre. JLLC offers various programs in learning foreign languages- English, French, German and Spanish to feel and enjoy the cosmopolitan culture. The vision of JLLC is to empower and encourage the students to meet their individual language goals and the needs of the diverse student population.

JLCC strives to meet the demands of the modern multilingual trend in the very concept of communication in the global language scenario. The centre offers a programme in the Learning Studying Reading & Writing (LSRW) of English, French, German and Spanish languages through the levels of beginner, intermediate and advanced to foster the basic communication skills.

The Centre for Continuing Professional Development (CCPD)

The Centre for Continuing Professional Development (CCPD) has been keen to build purposeful learning into the routine of each individual's professional life. A bunch of well experienced trainers with expertise in human relations, social capital management, social psychology and social dynamics have been training professionals from various backgrounds and walks of life. The Centre has conducted more than 100 training programs across the country for various Governmental and Non-Governmental organizations.

Clubs and Associations

Commerce Club

Commerce club is a forum, which is designed to provide an in-depth understanding of the multinational environment. The club provides a comprehensive understanding of the cultural, financial, geopolitical, national and international economic issues that affect commerce activities. The club regularly organizes programmes like extension lectures, seminars and industry interactive sessions to suit the latest industrial demands.

Management Association

Management association of the BBA department provides students the opportunity to develop the managerial and administrative skills. The programs of the association aims to develop planning, coordinating and decision making skills of the students and equip them to face industrial challenges. Under the banner of Management

Association, the department organizes exhibitions, workshops, management festivals and experiential learning activities.

Computer Academy

Journalism Club

The main objective of the journalism club is to empower the media aspirants in Kristu Jayanti College with creative talents that enable them to be resourceful and competitive in ever changing media scenario. Towards this end, the club regularly provides innumerable opportunities to understand the latest developments in the media, both in style and content. Activities like mock-press, public communication for social transformation, debates, newsletter publishing, press release preparations, Ad campaigns, quizzes, etc., are a few events where students get opportunities to become more expressive. The club also conducts regular workshops and seminars for the student journalists to attain hands-on experiences. Moreover, every year the club organizes summer internship programme for budding journalists.

Film and Photography Club

The Film and Photography Club organizes regular screening of artistic cinema, documentaries and photo exhibitions. This forum provides the students an opportunity to watch, discuss and review films and photography. The club also conducts workshops in photography and film making. Moreover, it is a fantastic launch-pad for the student aspirants in the field, exposing them to liberal arts and critical thinking.

Life Science Club

The Life Science Club provides a platform for the students to showcase their talents in academic as well as in co- curricular activities. The club aims at training the students to improve their skills and motivates them to participate and compete in inter- collegiate events, lecture competition, paper presentations, essay writing etc. The Life Science Club serves as a forum for expert talks by renowned personnel from various industries, national and international institutions. This helps the students to update their knowledge and keep pace with rapid scientific development. It provides opportunities for students to exhibit their innovative and creative ideas during the exhibitions and fests conducted by the club. The club activities assist the students to utilize their talents in the best way and help them to achieve their goals.

Psychology Club

The psychology club aims to create awareness about the various fields of Psychology and facilitates involvement of students in seminars, projects and presentations. The club actively engages in community services with differently abled children and adults. Intra and inter collegiate fests are organized under the aegis of the club.

Tourism Club

The Tourism club provides practical experience to theoretical components dealt in classroom. It enables students to prepare tour plans, financial plans, destination exploration and management. World tourism day is celebrated with food fests, cultural programmes, kite festival and exhibitions.

Environment Club

The Environment Club of Kristu Jayanti College aims to create awareness on various environmental issues that are rampant today. Unless environmental issues are solved or taken care of, the future generations may find earth not worth living. There is no denying the fact that environment has to be protected and conserved so as to make our future life possible. The Environment Club strives to make the students conscious of their responsibilities towards the environment and practice the principles of reduction, reuse and recycling of resources. The Environment Club instigates a sense of responsibility for the environment and a personal commitment to protect and preserve the environment among the youth.

Erudite Club

The literature club or the Erudite Club's objective is to develop and sharpen the literary skills of the students through book reviews, creative writing, debates and reportorial skills. It organizes Delphia - the English fest, live exhibition and poetry slam competitions. The club provides training in theatre and organizes shakespearean play annually. The club encourages students to make original contribution and publishes newsletters and magazines.

Kannada Club

The Department of Kannada, through the Kannada club is taking an initiative to promote the rich heritage of Kannada language through empowering and energizing students to exhibit their skills through active participation and to inherit the insight of Kannada cultural dynamism. The club organizes poetry recitation, panel discussions on Kannada literature related issues, theatre workshop, book reviews, guest lectures, film screening and quiz for the students.

Jnana Sanskriti - Kristu Jayanti College Hindi Sangha

Jnana Sanskriti fosters promotion and growth of Hindi language among students and faculty, by creating a vibrant atmosphere through different activities. Jnana Sanskriti has a bouquet of activities for making learning fun and enjoyable experience. Literary activities like quiz, essay, story and creative writing, debating, poster presentation, etc. The students are also encouraged to contribute articles for publications.

Opportunities are also created to learn and enhance language skills through certificate courses.

Professional Interface Forum (PIF)

Professional Interface Forum is an exclusive platform for all students who have registered for the B.Com Professional programme, where students pursue their B.Com degree along with professional courses such as Chartered Accountancy (CA) and Company Secretary (CS). The Forum was set up to enable students to remain in continuous touch with industry and professional bodies through interaction with the corporate world at frequent intervals. The students are provided with the luxury of having personal interactive sessions with people of esteemed personalities.

Current Affairs Forum

It is essential for a person to understand and know the environment which he works with. Through this forum, students are informed about the latest developments that take place in the world from time to time. Through critical evaluation of daily news and weekly reports, debates, group discussions, etc., students not only gain a comprehensive knowledge but also equip themselves with the demands of the present day world. Apart from this, the forum also stresses upon communication and presentation skills.

Women Empowerment Cell

The women empowerment cell engages, sensitizes and empowers the students of the institution towards the cause of gender equality. The cell organizes annual conferences, guest lectures, workshops and awareness programmes. The annual art and craft exhibition 'Srujana' provides opportunity to women entrepreneurs. Kristu Jayanti College has an active Women's Cell to empower women to draw strength from previous experiences and make them realize their potential. Sessions on awareness and Women's Health are being conducted by the cell.

International Students Forum

Educational culture prevailing in the campus opens its doors to overseas students. Their educational experience in the campus is facilitated through the International Students Forum (ISF) of the college which offers services like arrangement of secure accommodation, administrative support to process papers for their visas, sanctioning of leave for renewal of visa & student counselling.

Literary and Cultural Association (LCA)

Extracurricular activities are a critical component for students to shape their future as it helps develop their talents, interests and passion. Kristu Jayanti College under the banner of the LCA provides a spectrum of opportunities that a student might be interested in and can develop a passion for. Kalajyothi - the intracollegiate literary and cultural fest, music and dance concerts, workshops and training programs, etc., are few of the many avenues for cultural and artistic expression organized by the LCA.

Theatre Workshop and Training

Workshops / training in mime, skit, one act play and drama are held annually. These programmes enable fine-tuning the theatrical and acting skills of students. The workshop is handled by nationally renowned theatre exponents. The students are inducted into rigorous training after a selection process that includes many rounds. The workshop spans for 50 hours and includes training in acting, expression, makeup, lighting, etc. The college teams trained through the workshop have excelled in zonal, national level events and various intercollegiate events. Students who successfully complete the training session / workshop are eligible to earn 3 extension credits.

Training in Choir

Professional training and guidance is provided to students to equip them with basic knowledge on music theory. Students selected through an audition are trained to master the basics of singing such as breathing technique, range, ear training, scales, intervals, modulation, etc. The choir, after the training session performs during 'Woodrock' the music concert held during each semester and at various prestigious intercollegiate music festivals. Students who successfully complete the choir training of 50 hours are eligible to earn 3 extension credits.

Guitar Certification Course

Music training sessions in Guitar give an opportunity for students to learn the basics and advanced modules in playing the musical instrument. Training sessions are held twice a week to cover 40 hours of training. During this course, students have the option of choosing either Basic or Intermediate or Advanced levels. Students who successfully complete the choir training are eligible to earn 3 extension credits.

Sports and Games Club

Sports and games are essential for the development of a healthy person. Students are encouraged to take part in sports and games and made to understand that 'a healthy mind resides in a healthy body'. The club was established to develop athleticism to keep students healthy and in good spirit. This club provides specialist coaching and training opportunities for committed performers.

Parent Teachers Association

The college maintains a good relationship with parents in giving formation to their wards. Feedback from parents is considered as a right input to fine tune the entire academic process in college. Parent Teacher meet is organized once every semester wherein the student's performance in term exams, attendance, etc., are discussed by the class animators and subject lecturers with the parent / guardian.

Jayantian Extension Services (JES)

JES was started to promote social concern and good citizenship among the students through extension and social outreach programmes. The objectives of JES are:

- To assess the needs of the local community
- To establish institution-neighborhood network
- To promote holistic development of nearby villages
- To plan and liaison with various departments in their outreach and extension programmes

National Service Scheme (NSS)

NSS is a body for social service affiliated to the Bangalore University. Various programs are implemented through regular activities of the volunteers under the guidance of NSS programme officer. The main objective of the association is to arouse social consciousness among students to provide an opportunity to work for the underprivileged and the marginalized sections of our community. This would enable the students to develop personal goals and commitment to the larger community to which they belong.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC is the single largest uniformed youth organization of the world which functions to develop qualities of character, leadership, comradeship, courage, discipline, spirit of adventure, secular outlook and the ideals of selfless service amid the youth of the country. National Cadet Corps is a tri-services organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The college has an NCC Army wing under 3KAR (BN) NCC. Students are enrolled for a period of 3 years. The NCC wing of the college organizes regular parades with the support of the battalion and cadets take part in camps, certificate exams etc. Also the NCC wing is actively involved in conducting various events which enable the cadets to be patriotic and socially responsible citizens.

The Centre for Social Activities (CSA)

Programs such as Bhavishyajyothi – a student initiated social development program aimed at providing educational sponsorship and learning aids to social and economically under privileged rural school students, Vikas Kendra – a free tuition program conducted by the student volunteers of the CSA for students of Government schools; Awareness programs in the neighborhood on important social issues are organized by the CSA.

Kristu Jayanti Alumni Association

The bond between students and Kristu Jayanti College continues even after their graduation. Job placement assistance, opportunities for continuing education and alumni activities and similar events are some of the benefits available to Kristu Jayanti Alumni. The alumni also facilitate placements, building industry – institution relationship. Mitrotsava, the annual alumni meet, enables re union and a rejuvenating atmosphere amidst the alumni.



School of Management (MBA & PGDM)

Programme Overview

MBA & PGDM curriculum of Kristu Jayanti School of Management is designed to develop ethical corporate leaders with skills to respond to the rapid, often unpredictable, technological, social, and economic changes that are affecting industries, companies, and employees. It is a two year full time management programme spanning over six trimesters.

Programme Objectives

The main objective of the programme is to impart to the students professional education and training in various aspects of modern management. This will provide them an opportunity to develop conceptual and analytical skills and will foster attitudes essential for the development of students into competent and effective managers, in a competitive environment.

Eligibility for Admission

Candidates who have obtained a Bachelor's degree (10+2+3), Master's Degree from a recognized university in disciplines of Commerce, Management, Arts, Science, Engineering/Technology, or equivalent and have secured not less than 50 per cent of marks in aggregate (including languages) in the Bachelor's Degree Examination are eligible for admission to this programme. Candidates should also have CAT/CMAT/KMAT scores.

Single / Dual Specialization

Streams of electives are offered in International Finance, Finance, Human Resource, Marketing, and General Management. Specialization papers will be developed and updated from time to time. A student will have to take all the 10 elective courses in a stream to qualify for a specialization in that area in case of single specialization. A student who wishes to choose dual specialization, he/she has to choose 3+2 courses in Trimester IV and 2+3 courses in Trimester VI each from both the streams except International Finance. School of Management will have final say to offer electives based on the requisite minimum number of students opted for a course in any particular trimester.

Internship and Project Report

The students are required to undergo internship training along with Project for a period of 10 weeks as a part of their MBA/PGDM programme during fifth trimester. This training will be required to be carried out after the Fourth End Trimester Examinations. During the project the students must work in an organization for a period of 10 weeks and study the company closely to understand the company with regard to its inception, performance, departments, industry, products and any related company specific problem.

In this project work the students are required to take up research work with any

organization. This research project will identify a problem in the organization and analyze the company's resources/environment for solutions. The internship and project work will carry 6 credits. 150 marks (100 marks for Project work and 50 marks for Viva Voce Examination).

Additional Impetus

Corporate Interface

Corporate Interface is ensured by continuous interaction with Industry experts in the 3I (Industry-Institute-Interface) programmes and Management Development Programmes (MDPs) besides Industry visits which carries 5 credits spanning over first four trimesters and in sixth trimester.

Rural Exposure Programme & CSR Initiatives

This programme enables the students to understand the environment of villages and makes them socially sensitive. The student has to spend minimum 30 hours in village in the first trimester of the programme to earn two credits. The students need to prepare a report of their experience and submit it to the Department.

Presentation of a Research Paper in National/ International Conference or Publication of Research Paper in a Reputed Journal

Students would be guided by the faculty members to take up any research area leading to presenting/publishing research papers solely/jointly (maximum two persons) in the national and international conferences and symposia during the first four trimesters to earn one credit.

Six-Sigma Certification

Students are given SIX-SIGMA Green Belt Certification to face the current corporate challenges.

Business Analytics Course

Students are trained on Business Analytical Skills using latest statistical software packages.

The curriculum and pedagogy are synchronized to enhance the managerial skills that suit the requirements of the industry. The CIMA (Chartered Institute of Management Accountants) recognizes professionals who meet the highest benchmark of quality, competency, and integrity. It provides the competency framework to define the skills that management accountants need for today and for the future. Students pursuing BBA with CIMA are eligible for 9 papers exemptions out of total 16 towards the CIMA qualification. They are required to study and complete 7 papers to qualify for CIMA which leads to CGMA (Chartered Global Management Accountant) recognition. The course also provides opportunity to gain additional qualifications like Certificate in Business Accounting, Diploma in Management Accounting, Advanced Diploma in Management Accounting, Certificate in IFRS.

B.Com. with ACCA (Association of Chartered Certified Accountants)

Programme Overview

The B.Com (Integrated) program helps students to get exemption of first six papers of ACCA after the completion of first year. Since the curriculum is already integrated or embedded in the B.Com syllabus, the students can finish ACCA Professional qualification without much additional training. The student has to write only 8 external papers to get the ACCA qualification out of 14 papers. Along with the ACCA Qualification, students are eligible for getting a certificate in IFRS from ACCA and ICFE (International Certificate in Financial English) from University of Cambridge after the 3rd Semester. In addition to this, students have options for getting an Advanced Diploma and B.Sc in Applied Accounting after the completion 3rd Semester.

The syllabus comprises 14 examinations. The qualification is structured in two parts. The Fundamentals level consists of 9 examinations: F1 Accountant in Business, F2 Management Accounting, F3 Financial Accounting, F4 Corporate and Business Law,

F5 Performance Management, F6 Taxation, F7 Financial Reporting, F8 Audit and Assurance, and F9 Financial Management.

The Professional level involves 5 examinations. Within the Professional level three papers are compulsory: P1 Governance, Risk and Ethics; P2 Corporate Reporting; and P3 Business Analysis. Two of the following four options papers must also be completed: P4 Advanced Financial Management, P5 Advanced Performance Management, P6 Advanced Taxation and P7 Advanced Audit and Assurance.

B.Sc. (Microbiology, Biochemistry, Genetics - MBG)

Programme Overview

Biotechnology

Biotechnology is an area of multi-disciplinary sciences, involving a variety of distinct subjects where living organisms or their derivatives are modified and put into effective use in catering the welfare of humanity. Applications of Biotechnology have been found in several sectors, including Agriculture, Food Science and Medicine. Realizing the immense potential of Biotechnology in opening up newer avenues of employment and the need for skilled and trained human resources, graduate programme in Biotechnology is offered. This three year degree course is structured in such a way that the students get an opportunity to explore in depth the theoretical and practical aspects in various areas of Biotechnology. The course introduces the students to detailed study of biological molecules, Cell biology, Genetics, Microbiology, Biophysics, Molecular biology, Recombinant DNA technology, Genetic engineering, Environmental biotechnology, Animal biotechnology, Immunology and Plant biotechnology and makes a student a biotechnologist who can pursue further and contribute to this field in the area of one's interest.

Microbiology

Microbiology is the study of microscopic organisms, their activities and applications. Although small in size, microorganisms play an enormous role in many areas of society including food, pharmaceutical and biotechnology industries, health science, agriculture, and the environment. Microbes are often used as a model system to study Microbiology. So, Microbiology is the core of the emerging field of life sciences and career opportunities are limitless. In recognition of the importance of Microbiology and the abundant career opportunities, KristuJayanti College offers Bachelor Degree in Microbiology. The degree provides sound theoretical and laboratory expertise in the diverse area of Microbiology. The college has incorporated the latest and most up to date laboratory facilities. Besides, abundant employment opportunities at the bachelor's level, Microbiology major provides a sound foundation for specialized studies in Microbiology. The diversity of subjects covered under Microbiology provides a wide knowledge for a career in pharmaceutical and food industry, human health, agriculture, etc.

Biochemistry

Biochemistry deals with understanding living organisms in chemical terms. Areas illuminated by bio- chemical knowledge have broadened enormously. Genetics

It also deals with conserving and utilizing the plants, gene bank management, in vitro conservation, in situ conservation including genetic resource and animal breeding. A sound knowledge of genetics is essential for an understanding of all other fields of biology particularly Cytology, Embryology, Molecular biology, Physiology, etc. Genetics is a subject that unifies biology and serves as its 'core'.

Programme Overview

In this three-year degree course, the electives are Journalism, Psychology and Computer Science, English Literature, Political Science, History, Tourism and Economics.

Eligibility for Admission

A student securing 40 per cent aggregate marks including languages in P.U.C / 10 +2 / Pre University equivalent course is eligible.

Journalism

This course aims at molding the students for a career in Journalism, both print and electronic media broadcasting, and in allied fields like advertising and film. The course introduces various facets of the profession of Journalism with a blend of theoretical knowledge and hands on experience. The curriculum comprises eight papers and is carefully tailored to prepare students for specialized media and mass communication needs. Furthermore, the curriculum also provides them the broad liberal arts education necessary to succeed as effective communicators in today's challenging media scenario.

Psychology

A course in Psychology will equip the students with an in depth knowledge in various fields of Psychology like child psychology, industrial psychology, counseling psychology, clinical psychology personality development etc. In addition to the theory papers the students have practical papers every year which will give them practical insight into the subjects.

Computer Science

During the three years of study the students gain intensive theoretical and practical knowledge and are steered towards becoming proficient in programming languages, Content Management, Visual Programming, Java Programming and UNIX, LINUX Operating System. During the final year of study, students have an opportunity to interact with the industry and work on live projects that are part of their curriculum.

English Literature (Optional English)

English has been an integral part of various walks of life in India for centuries. One might even say that it has become inseparable from the essence of contemporary Indian culture. The study of language is a key in understanding the history of any age. The three year English literature course offers students an opportunity to understand

the literary, cultural and social dynamism of England's varied past, European and Non-European writing and integrates Indian writing in English facilitating a transcendence of linguistic nativism.

The glory of a bygone era is obviously of no use unless it can be utilized to enlighten the present. On the practical side, this course offers numerous employment opportunities in the field of teaching, journalism, publishing, writing, etc. Most importantly, a sound understanding of the language equips the student with communication skills, which is an indispensable part of success in any field in today's competitive world.

Political Science

The course in political science aims at providing comprehensive programme of instruction and research in the fundamental areas of the discipline: political institutions and processes; the origins, development and transformation of theory and concepts; understanding different approaches to political analysis; political philosophy; social theory; political economy, public administration, its principles, international relations, approaches to world politics and peace thus making one an ideal citizen and a good administrator. The programme includes the process of experiential learning through field visits. The curriculum comprises of eight papers carefully designed to prepare students to face competitive exams and to make them an ideal citizen.

History

The Department of History is committed to bring historical knowledge into conversation with issues of contemporary relevance. Studying History inculcates critical appreciation of art, culture, heritage and research of social relevance. The department aims to train young men and women to develop wholesome personality committed towards excellence.

Tourism

Tourism in India has significant potential considering the rich cultural and historical heritage, variety in ecology, terrains and places of natural beauty spread across the country. Taking into account the importance and the abundant career opportunities, this course provides students with in-depth knowledge on the emerging trends in Travel and Tourism Management with both theory and practical papers. The curriculum enables the students to adapt to the demands and make them face the challenges of today's Tourism and Travel industry. The students are trained to be professionals who can succeed in the industry which has no regional, gender, language or age barriers and where talent reaps success. The curriculum comprises of eight papers and the students will have an opportunity to be part of the industrial training through internships.

Economics

Economics plays a key role in all aspects of life and is an important subject worth knowing more about. It is a vast subject which starts with the humble fact that

“Scarcity” is the ultimate reality. It teaches us ways as to how societies, governments, businesses, households, and individuals allocate their scarce resources with the aim of reaching “the pareto optimality”. The study of this subject gives a strong background in micro & macroeconomics theory, about international financial institutions, knowledge in various applied areas of economics, knowledge of relevant mathematical and statistical techniques, and expertise in the use of computers for the analysis of data as well as in the ability to use the analytical tools of economics in problem solving. The complementary study of econometrics, the primary quantitative method used in the discipline, enables students to become critical consumers of statistically based arguments about numerous public and private issues rather than passive recipients unable to sift through the statistics. By the end of the degree one emerges as a student who can read competently as a law graduate, compute effectively as an accountant, and analyze data flawlessly as a statistician. Thus the study of Economics is integral to Social Studies knowledge.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is adopted by the college with an objective to enable the students towards vertical and horizontal mobility in learning. Under this system, the students have the option to choose from a list of courses offered by different departments and acquire credits through interdisciplinary learning. Moreover, this approach will broaden the academic sphere at par with global standards. CBCS is adopted by the college for all Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes from 2015 onwards. UG students can earn four credits through CBCS courses during their fourth Semester. The PG students (except MBA) can earn four credits during their third semester. Whereas, MBA and PGDM students can earn three credits during their third trimester.

Assessment Regulations - UG & PG Programme

Programme Pattern

UG Programme – Semester Pattern

UG programmes follow semester pattern with each programme spanning across six semesters. Each semester will have 90 working days.

PG Programme – Semester Pattern

PG programmes follow semester pattern (except for MBA/PGDM which follow trimester pattern). MA / M Sc. / M Com / MSW programmes span across four semesters where each semester will have 90 working days. MCA programme span across six semesters where each semester will have 90 working days. MBA and PGDM programme span across six trimesters where each trimester will have 60 – 65 working days.

The autonomous curriculum follows credit system and the students should achieve the required minimum number of credits to be declared as pass for the respective programme. The institution follows Choice Based Credit System and Nine Point Grade Scale system.

Evaluation Process

Assessment Norms – UG Programme

Students' academic performance is assessed throughout the semester.

Continuous assessment of student is done throughout the semester based on the following:

- Performance in Mid Term Examination (Internal Examination)
- Assignment
- Attendance
- Performance in End Semester Examination

Evaluation is based on Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) which carries 30 percent weightage (30 marks out of 100) and End Semester Examination (ESE) which carries 70 percent weightage (70 marks out of 100).

Assessment Norms – PG Programme

Students' academic performance is assessed throughout the semester/trimester based on the following:

- Performance in the Mid Term Examination (Internal Examination)
- Assignment
- Seminar
- Case Study/Mini Project/Paper Presentation

- Performance in End Semester/Trimester Examination

CIA III : Attendance (UG Programme)

A student can attain maximum of 5 marks based on his/her attendance percentage for each course. Marks allotted will be as follows:

- If attendance is in the range 95% - 100% assign 5 marks out of 5
- If attendance is in the range 90% - 94% assign 4 marks out of 5
- If attendance is in the range 85% - 89% assign 3 marks out of 5
- If attendance is in the range 75% - 84% assign 2 marks out of 5

End Semester Examination (ESE)

The time table of ESE will be notified three weeks before the examination. The duration of the examination will be three hours for each course.

The question paper for the End Semester Theory Examination will be out of 70 marks and the End Semester Practical Examination will be out of 35 marks.

MBA/PGDM courses having 2 or 3 credits will have End Trimester Examination conducted out of 50 marks. The CIA component total marks for those courses will be 25 marks.

MBA/PGDM courses having 4 credits will have End Trimester Examination conducted out of 70 marks. The CIA component total marks for those courses will be 30 marks.

Eligibility conditions to receive hall ticket and appear for End Semester Examination

- Admission procedures done and admission eligibility documents submitted on time
- Minimum 85% attendance for each course
- Applied for the ESE and paid the Examination Fee on time
- No disciplinary complaints from the Class Animator / HOD / Dean / COE / Management

Note:

Students who fail to apply for the End Semester Examination (by submitting the appropriate form and paying examination fee on the scheduled dates given in the calendar) shall not be allowed to appear for the examination and shall not be promoted to the subsequent Semester/Trimester of the programme.

2.4 Passing Criteria

- No minimum pass mark for CIA
- ESE (End Semester Examination) alone 35%
25 marks out of 70
- (ESE + CIA) aggregate 40% or 40 marks out of 100

Passing Minimum for PG

- No minimum pass mark for CIA

- ESE (End Semester Examination) alone 40%
28 marks out of 70
- (ESE + CIA) aggregate 50 % or 50 marks out of 100

Pass Status for a Programme

The student must acquire the total number of credits allotted for the programme for achieving the degree. The total credits include:

UG Programme

- o Academic Credits
- o Life Skill Training (2 Credits)
- o Extension Credits (3 Credits)
- o Add On Credits (If any)

PG Programme

- o Academic Credits
- o Extension Credits (varies according to programme)
- o Add On Credits (If any)

UG students who have achieved academic credits but could not achieve the requisite credits of life skill training, extension credits and add-on credits are not eligible for awarding the degree.

PG students who have achieved academic credits but could not achieve the requisite extension and add-on credits are not eligible for awarding the degree.

Result Announcement

All the results (CIA component marks or End Semester Examination marks) are published online through the Campus Management Solution (CMS) link provided in the home page of the college website (www.kristujayanti.edu.in). Students are requested to check the college mail, frequently visit the college notice boards and website for the public notices and announcements.

Announcement of Term Examination results are published online within twenty days after the examination. Other CIA component marks are published at the end of the semester/trimester online through the Campus Management Solution (CMS). Students shall receive the valued answer scripts/assignments from the respective course teacher within ten days of the examination or assignment submission.

Results of End Semester/Trimester Examinations are published within 30 days after the last day of examination.

There is no provision of improvement for the CIA component marks or End Semester Examination marks.

Grievance Redressal

There is a grievance redressal cell which include COE and Dy. COE's. Grievances pertaining to CIA component marks should be addressed to the COE/Dy. COE's within two days from the announcement of CIA component marks in the Campus

Management Solution. Grievances pertaining to End Semester Examination marks should be addressed to the COE/Dy. COE's within one week from the announcement of the ESE results online. Grievances will be addressed within ten days of the request by the COE.

Revaluation

There is provision to apply for revaluation for the theory courses of UG programme. Student should have secured minimum 15% of marks in the End Semester Examination (11 marks out of 70) in order to be eligible to apply for revaluation. Student has to fill the revaluation form and pay the revaluation application fee on the scheduled dates of application as per the announcement. Results of revaluation shall be published within 20 days after the application. The best among the original marks and the revaluation marks will be retained as the final marks for the course.

Note

There is no provision to apply for revaluation for the practical courses. There is no provision to apply for revaluation for the courses of PG programme.

Supplementary Examination

Students can apply for supplementary examination on the scheduled dates given in the calendar pertaining to the following rules:

- Odd Semester Courses supplementary examination application can be done only with odd semester End Semester Examination.
- Even Semester Courses supplementary examination application can be done only with even semester End Semester Examination.

Besides there is provision for special supplementary examination. Once the results of the final semester/trimester is announced students who are having supplementary shall be allowed to appear for special supplementary examinations where he/she can appear for final year supplementary courses provided the student has passed in all the courses of the previous years of the UG/PG programme.

The results of the supplementary/special supplementary examinations will be announced within 30 days after the last day of the examination.

Choice Based Credit System

Under Graduate and Post Graduate students follow Choice Based Credit System. UG students have the freedom to choose among the different courses offered by other deaneries during the fourth semester of their UG programme. PG students have the freedom to choose among the different courses offered by the deaneries during the third semester/trimester of their PG programme.

Criteria for Promotion to the next Semester/Trimester

- Under Graduate or Post Graduate students who are not having more than Sixty percentage of attendance without considering medical leave shall not be eligible for promotion to the subsequent semester/trimester.
- Under Graduate or Post Graduate students who do not appear for End Semester/Trimester Examinations of two consecutive semesters/trimesters are not eligible for promotion to the subsequent semester/trimester.
- Under Graduate or Post Graduate students who have not applied for End Semester/Trimester Examinations by paying the due examination fee are not eligible to be promoted to the subsequent semester/trimester.



Life Skills Education - Guidelines

- All UG students under the Autonomous system should earn the add on course credits (two credits) by completing the Life Skills Education (LSE).
- The training on Life Skill Education is offered by Centre for Life Skills Education of the college.
- The course is being conducted at the beginning of the academic year (beginning of UG programme). For those students who are unable to complete the LSE held at the beginning of the programme due to unavoidable circumstances special session on LSE will be held during the month of November (during the first semester holidays).
- The credits earned through Life Skill Education shall be depicted in the Fourth semester marks card.
- Students failing to earn the two credits through Life Skill Education before the commencement of the second semester have to register for the same by remitting the requisite fee and undergo LSE training before the commencement of third semester. Students failing to do so will have Reappear status depicted in their Fourth Semester Marks Card.
- Certification in Life Skills Education is mandatory. This cannot be substituted by any other add on course.
- Students failing to earn the two credits for Life Skills Education during their UG programme will not have Pass Status and are not eligible for Graduation.

Extension Credits - Guidelines

- All UG students under the Autonomous system should earn three credits as extension credits during the first four semesters of the UG Programme.
- Extension credits(three credits) shall be depicted in the Fifth semester marks card.
- Students failing to acquire three extension credits by the fourth semester shall have Reappear status depicted in their Fifth Semester Marks Card.
- Students who do not earn the three extension credits within first three semesters have to register for the add on courses offered by the respective department by remitting specified fee and attend the same in order to earn the three credits by the fourth semester of the UG programme.
- Students failing to achieve the three extension credits during their UG programme shall not have pass status and are not eligible for awarding graduation certificate.

UG Students can achieve Extension Credits by following means:

1. Outstanding Literary/Cultural Achievement (not less than runners up position at the Literary and Cultural Fest conducted by the University or not lesser than third position in the Zonal/National Level Fests conducted by the Association of Indian Universities).
2. Outstanding Sports Achievement (not less than runners up position at the University Tournament/Athletic Meet conducted by the University or not lesser than third position in the Zonal/National Level Tournament/Athletic Meet conducted by the Association of Indian Universities).
3. Member of Jayantian Extension Services(JES) - NCC, NSS or CSA and has been an active member of the same during the first four semesters of the UG Programme by fulfilling the regulations laid down by the respective Association/Body/Unit.
4. Students who attended add on courses with not less than 85% attendance and completed/passed the respective courses are eligible for three extension credits. Add on courses include:
 - CIMA Course (BBA 2017 Batch students onwards)
 - Company Secretary & Chartered Accountancy Course (B Com Professional students and students from other programmes who have registered for the same)
 - ACCA Course (B Com ACCA students)
 - Civil Service Examination Training Course
 - Hindi Parishad Examination Training Course
 - Foreign Language Course
 - Specific Add On courses offered by the respective department
 - Training programmes or workshops offered/organized by the college for enhancing skills in areas such as Theatre, Guitar, Choir, Dance, Fine Arts, etc.

Note:

Besides being a member, student should fulfill the other requirements prescribed by the respective Club/Association/Body/Unit for earning the credits and the eligibility for credits shall be authorized by the respective faculty coordinator.



Admission Procedure

- Online Applications are made available in Admission section of website and can be submitted online. Applicants are provided assistance to make submissions from college campus
 - Timely updates and notifications regarding counselling schedules and application status are provided in the website for applicants to refer.
 - The applicants are expected to report for an interview in the college campus on call by the admission officer via email, where he/she has to be accompanied by his / her parent with valid Marks Cards (SSLC, PUC or equivalent) and other relevant credentials to prove their eligibility
 - If selected, the remaining formalities of admissions have to be completed within two days which includes submission of the following certificates along with two set of photocopies to the college office along with fee for first year, followed by a final interview with the Principal.
 - Transfer Certificate from the School (for UG) / College (for PG) last attended
 - PUC or equivalent marks card
 - Conduct Certificate
 - Migration Certificate (in case of students who have passed any examination other than Karnataka PU Examination)
 - 10th std. marks card
 - Passport size and stamp size photos (5 nos.)
- Additional documents to be produced by Foreign Students:
- Valid student VISA
 - HIV Test Clearance Certificate
 - Residential permit from the Police Commissioner

Attendance and Academics

- Each working day has a forenoon session of four periods and an afternoon session of three periods. Value Added / Certificate Courses will be conducted as the 3rd hour in the afternoon session. Unless otherwise mentioned Saturdays will have only forenoon sessions.
- The second Saturday of every month is a holiday.
- Students are expected to be seated in the classroom before the bell.
- Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each class. Latecomers may be permitted to attend the class but attendance will not be given.
- Payment of exam fees is no guarantee that a student will be permitted to appear for the semester exam. Permission for admission for the University Examination will not be granted unless :
 - i) A student has put in a minimum of 85% of attendance in each subject at the end

of each semester, failing which he / she will not be eligible to appear for the end semester examination.

ii) A student gets a required pass mark / grade in the examinations / assignment conducted by the college as per the norms laid down by the college.

iii) The Principal is satisfied with the character and conduct of the student.

- In the case of unavoidable circumstances, an application for leave must be submitted to the Principal not later than three days of return to the college.
- The Principal may reject the application for leave if he is not satisfied with the authenticity.
- The application for leave / absence in case of participation in co-curricular activities should carry the signatures of the staff coordinator, class animator, HoD and the Principal.

Fees

- The fees shall be paid for the full year on the day of admission. Fees once paid will not be refunded.
- The students should keep the receipt of their fees paid for future reference.
- Students should clear all their dues to the college before collecting their admission card for the University examination.
- Second and third year students are expected to pay the fees before commencement of the next academic year.

Kristu Jayanti Scholarship Scheme (KJSS)

KJSS aims to recognize the students who are outstanding in academics, co-curricular & extra-curricular activities, and to assist the students who are economically backward. KJSS categories :

i) Jayantian Achievement Grant (JAG) for excellence in academics

ii) Jayantian Talent Grant (JTG) for University / State / National Level Winners in Sports / Literary & Cultural events

iii) Jayantian Upliftment Scholarship (JUS) for economically backward students.

A Review Committee will scrutinize the application forms and the Principal will approve the beneficiaries under KJSS. Deserving students will be awarded with the scholarship at the end of the academic year.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The Grievance Redressal Cell is set up to probe into the student grievances. It redresses the grievances at individual and class level and grievances of common interest. The Cell maintains a conducive and unprejudiced educational environment. Complaints dropped in the 'Suggestion Box' by students and parents and verbal complaints are also redressed. All complaints are scrutinized by the management and the grievance redressal cell.

Anti Ragging Committee

Ragging is strictly prohibited in the campus. Inconvenience in any manner to the students, especially the 1st year students, by counterparts or senior students is a punishable offence. An anti-ragging committee is functional in the college which addresses issues related to ragging or any form of inconvenience in the campus and off campus. The names and phone numbers of the members of the anti-ragging committee are displayed on the college notice board.

General Instructions

- Boys and Girls are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and maturity in their dress code, sense of discipline and in their personal relationships
- They will greet their teachers on the occasion when first meeting them for the day within the premises of the college and whenever they meet them in public
- The campus must be kept clean at all times. They shall not deface the wall, furniture, etc. Damage or destruction of the college property is a punishable offence
- Students must not attend or organize any meeting within the campus or collect money for any purpose or circulate any leaflets among the students or paste it on the notice board without the permission of the Principal
- Indulging in public activities that are of political nature is not encouraged
- Grievances of any kind must not be represented in collective petitions or through a body. Students are encouraged to present their cases either individually or through their representatives
- When the lecturer enters, the students must rise and remain standing till they are instructed to sit. When the attendance roll is called each one must rise and answer to his / her name or register number
- There will be periodical evaluation of the students' progress in each subject. A report of this will be accessible to the parent or guardian
- Students who are not permitted for the End Semester Examination will not ordinarily be re-admitted to the college
- Students should maintain a sense of decorum and discipline at all times both inside and outside the college. These who are guilty of serious misconduct inside / outside the college are liable to be expelled from the rolls of the college
- Smoking, alcoholism, substance abuse are punishable offences
- Every student is required to display his / her Identity Card when in campus
- As per Govt. instruction, use of mobile phone is prohibited inside the college building

Library

The library will be kept open from 8.30 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. on all working days and from 8.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on Saturdays

- Time of book issue: 1.45 p.m. to 4.45 p.m.
- Time for returning books: 8.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m.
- Book issue and return timings on Saturdays : 8.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m.
- Silence should be maintained in the library

Certificates

- Application for certificates must be made to the Principal in writing. If the certificates have to be sent by post, the application must be accompanied by a self- addressed stamped envelope.

Applications for certificates should contain the following details:

- The student's name in full
- The month and year of joining the college, register number and the course to which the student is enrolled
- In the case of alumni, the class in which the student was studying at the time of leaving the college and the register number
- A nominal fee shall be charged for every certificate
- Certificates in duplicate will only be issued with due permission from the Principal
- Migration Certificates should be obtained by a student only when he / she joins another University outside Karnataka. It is to be issued by the Bangalore University. To obtain the Migration Certificate, a 'No due Certificate' received from the college should be enclosed together with the application form that is available with the Controller of Examinations

Information for Parents

Parents and guardians are encouraged to call on the Principal and Heads of Departments at least once in a term to be informed about what has been the conduct and progress of the student. Parents can also access student progress / attendance / reports through college campus management system (iON). Separate login and password to access the iON system will be created for parents on request.
