# *Rules and Regulations*



## General Rules and Regulations

### Students should adhere to the following rules strictly:

1. Be punctual to the classes.
2. Stand up and wish when the faculty enter into the classroom and remain standing till you are asked to sit.
3. While you want to leave the class room during the lecture, proper prior permission must be obtained.
4. Do not make any noise while moving from classroom to classroom / lab.
5. Be polite to elders and courteous to all.
6. Do not throw paper or ink on the floor / corridors / staircases. Put all waste materials in the dust bins provided in various places.
7. Do not write anything on the walls or desks or on any college property.
8. No meeting of any cause shall be held without prior written permission from the Director.
9. The Students shall not collect money for any purpose without the permission from the Director.
10. No notice of any kind shall be circulated by students or pasted anywhere in the College Campus without prior permission from the Director.
11. No student shall take any Political activity inside the campus.
12. Students are themselves responsible for their personal belongings (Calculator, Cell Phones etc.). For loss of their property the college is not responsible.
13. Students should themselves develop habit to read the notice/circulars and other information displayed on the Notice Board and take appropriate action as directed thereof.
14. Any property found in the premises must be handed over to the office with relevant details.
15. Change of address is to be intimated to the office at the earliest.



16. Students should park their vehicles in the space meant for parking and wearing helmet is compulsory for two wheeler riders.
17. Students should desist from soiling the walls with their footwear marks or otherwise.
18. Always keep your environment clean.
19. Wear the Lanyard with Identity Card, as long as you are in the College campus.
20. Cell Phone
  - i. Cell Phone with camera facility is banned inside the college and Hall of Residence.
  - ii. Cell phones are to be switched off inside the academic buildings (class rooms, Laboratories and Library), if the students are found to use the cell phone in the Academic buildings, the Cell Phone would be confiscated.
  - iii. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against any one violating the above rules.
21. Smoking as well as consuming any form of intoxicants is strictly prohibited in the college and in the Hall of Residence.
22. Students must not conduct themselves so as to bring discredit to the College.
23. Self-discipline is expected from student at all common places like class rooms, Library, playground, canteen, Hall of common functions etc., Failing to abide will attract disciplinary action.
24. Wear clean and decent dresses. T-shirts, Jeans and baggy pants of any form are not permitted. Shirts with captions / psychedelic colours are not permitted.

### **Dress Code**

Every student of this college shall follow the following dress code:

1. Boys should wear full or half sleeve shirt tucked in and with shoes.
2. Whenever formal days are declared every male student is expected to wear a tie with shirt tucked - and come with shoes.

3. Student shall not wear "T" shirts / banians / Jeans / Sleeveless shirts or shorts for classes. Shorts will be allowed only in the sports fields.
4. Girls are expected to wear salwar suit with duppatta or saree, short tops or kurthas and leggings are not allowed.

#### **Dress Regulations During Practicals:**

- a. BOYS: Pant with Shirts tucked in with Closed foot-wear. The Colour for pant and shirt shall be as prescribed for the batch.
- b. GIRLS: Overcoat is to be worn over the regular dress along with the closed footwear. The Color of the overcoat shall be prescribed for the batch.
- c. Loose garments of any sort and chappals shall not be worn in the practical classes or during field work.

#### **Leave**

1. Students should not absent themselves from classes without proper leave application from Parents /Guardians.
2. Application for leave on prescribed format, approved by the respective class advisor should be submitted to the concerned HOD.
3. Permission to leave from the College premises during working hours could be granted by the Dean only.
4. Medical Certificate should be produced if the leave period exceeds 3 continuous days.
5. Students should produce evidence for the unpredictable cause if it is not sick leave.
6. Students who are all doing their project work outside the campus should submit their attendance certificate from the company for the period that they have attended.
7. Students should get prior permission to bring their own hardware / materials inside the college campus for doing project or other work and also should get the gate pass to take back their material.

## Ragging

Ragging is an offence and the accused is liable to be arrested & imprisoned in addition to being dismissed from the college.

Ragging is certainly not a necessary stepping stone to friendship. Friendship can only be made and maintained without ragging. It is for the youth themselves to find some saner means of expressing friendship with their juniors. Respect forced out by ragging cannot be genuine. It is only a respect shown under duress, semblance of respect tinged with fear of more ill treatment.

Subjecting a junior to shame by ragging certainly cannot make him respect his senior. It will only kindle fear and a silent despise for him at heart. Let this simple fact be known by all younger generation and protagonists of the customs.

The best solution is that youth should themselves banish from their mind, the barbaric idea of ragging anyone or subjecting him to any torture or shame in its name.

### Government order on Ragging

The government of Tamil Nadu has banned ragging in Educational Institutions by passing Government Order. "Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997".

Vide its order No. 7 of 1997 dated 26.07.1999, indulging in ragging will be punished as follows:

1. Imprisonment up to a term of two years
2. A fine up to Rs.10,000/-
3. Student convicted for ragging will be dismissed from the institution and shall not be admitted to any other Educational Institution in India.

### Text Library

#### General Conduct inside the Library

1. Complete silence shall be maintained inside the library.
2. Conversation in any form inside the library is discouraged. Due care must be taken not to disturb the environment of the library.
3. Outsiders are allowed into the library only with the prior permission of Chairman / Director / CAO / Deans of various schools and shall be accompanied by a college staff.
4. Cell phones, Eatables are strictly prohibited inside the library.
5. Make use of the electrical appliances like lights, fans etc. sparingly and if necessary.
6. Students shall follow prescribed dress code and they must avoid wearing aprons or over coats.
7. Change of personal information viz. address, contact numbers etc. shall be informed to the librarian and keep the records updated.

### Borrowings

1. UG students are eligible to borrow a maximum of 4 books.
2. PG students are eligible to borrow a maximum of 4 books.
3. Normal borrowing period is fixed at 15 continuous days (including holidays and non working days) for students; beyond which, non-return of the borrowed books

will invite penalty as per institution norms.

4. Renewal is allowed once only for a period of 7 continuous days, if there are no reservations.
5. "Non-Circulation materials" viz. Periodicals (Magazines, Newspapers, etc.) are not borrowable.
6. Reference books, Journals will not be issued for borrowing.
7. Faculty members and adjunct staff are eligible to borrow a maximum of 5 and retain it for a period of maximum 2 months in the first instance. He / She can borrow the same book after a gap of one day and can keep it for another two months.

### **Dos**

1. Keep personal belongings, bags, note books, folders etc. at the property counter positioned at the entry of library.
2. Make entry in the e-gate register (Software system with Bar code reader) both before entry into the library and before exit from the library.
3. Return the library books borrowed, on or before the due date.
4. Before borrowing the books verify the condition of the book and intimate the library authority if the book is damaged or soiled in any form. Failure to do so, fixes the responsibility on the borrower.
5. Loss of borrowed materials shall be informed to the Librarian promptly in writing.

### **Dont's**

1. Don't scribble, underline, and mark with highlighter inside the books borrowed.
2. Don't attempt using the services of the library staff for non-legitimate purposes.
3. Don't replace the books back into the shelves; they shall be taken care of by the library staff.

### **Digital Library**

Computers with internet connection have been provided for this purpose with a collection of digital media. All rules and regulations applicable to texts shall be applicable to digital media as well.

1. Entry must be made in the system usage register before and after using the digital library.
2. Any media borrowed shall be maintained with equal care.

### **Penalty**

#### **In the case of damage / loss or borrowed item:**

- The borrower has to replace the borrowed item (series in whole in case of borrowed item(s) is part of a set or series). The borrower may replace with the specific edition / higher edition / improved version (in the case of digital media) along with the bills of purchase. The fine will also be levied till the date of replacement as applicable (book / other media).
- On replacement by the borrower the damaged / soiled / defaced item will become the property of the borrower.
- 3 times the cost of borrowed item - in the case of non availability of the borrowed item in the market.

**Note:** Items that are not returned within 3 weeks from the due date are assumed to be lost by the candidate and the library will initiate replacement process.

## Hall of Residence Rules and Regulations

### I. Admissions

1. Application for admission to the Hall of Residence must be made in the prescribed form only. A student admitted to the college is not automatically eligible to become a member of the Hall of Residence.
2. Every student, before being admitted to the Hall of Residence shall give an undertaking in writing that he will abide by the rules and regulations of the Hall of Residence in force from time to time. These rules and regulations are binding on all residents.
3. Before admission, each student has to pay Hall of Residence fees which includes room rent mess fees, washing fees and caution deposit, which may be revised from time to time.
4. Every year, immediately after the final exam, students have to vacate the Hall of Residence and clear the breakage dues, if any. If there is any pending dues carried out to the next academic year, penalty will be levied as per the prevailing norms.

### II. Mess

1. Food will be served to the Hall of Residence by the caterers entrusted with the responsibility of running the mess of the Hall of Residence according to the menu and the rates prescribed by the administration as per the terms of the contract, or food will be served by the management as per the menu and rates fixed by the management from time to time.

#### 2. Mess timings:

Study Timing (Girls)	:	6:30 pm - 7:30 pm & 8:30 pm - 10:00 pm



*'Timings will be staggered between 1 year and other years for administrative Convenience and students' welfare.*

3. During study hours, the inmates should be present in their allotted rooms.
4. Entry into the hostel kitchen is strictly prohibited for the students.
5. Members should not demand any special service from the cook or other servants.
6. Visitors are permitted to meet their wards only during Visiting hours.

**Visiting hours:**

5.00 pm - 6.30 pm during working days

10.00 am - 6.00 pm during holidays.

7. No guest is allowed to stay in the Hall of Residence without prior permission from the Chief Warden / Warden.
8. Anyone falling sick is advised to inform Deputy Warden for necessary action. Inmates taking their own treatment without the knowledge of Deputy Warden should do at their own risk. Cost of the medical charges incurred for the inmates taking treatment through management must be reimbursed within one month by the students.
9. All inmates shall return to students residence premises by 6.30 pm Roll call will be taken around 7.00 pm for boys and girls every day.
10. On Sundays, students are permitted to go for outing from 9.00 am to 6.30 pm Those who wish to have their lunch in the mess on Sundays shall inform Deputy Warden on the previous day night.
11. In the common room where TV and other appliance are available, students should conduct themselves in an orderly manner.
12. Students can be away from the Hall of Residence (going to native, going to local guardians place) only with prior permission of the Warden/Deputy Warden.
13. Consumption of electricity should be minimized. The inmates should switch off fans & tubelights whenever moving out of the room.

### III Discipline

1. Every student in the Hall of Residence is expected to maintain strict discipline inside and outside the campus and uphold dignity of the Hall of Residence and the institution.
2. Shouting, whistling or causing disturbance in the Hall of Residence will be treated as breach of discipline.
3. Smoking is strictly prohibited. Law breakers will be severely punished. Any student found to have consumed intoxicants / narcotics will be dismissed from the Hall of Residence immediately without any enquiry.
4. The inmates must refrain from taking part in anti-social activity.
5. The inmates should not involve themselves in any political activity.
6. The inmates should not convene any meeting within the Hall of Residence or outside without the written permission of the Chief Warden and inmates are not allowed to display any notice without Chief Warden's permission.
7. Abnormal activities of any nature causing disturbance to neighbour should not be carried out in the rooms.
8. The inmates should not nail on the walls for hanging their cloth & posters.
9. The inmates should not remain in the Hall of Residence during the working hours/at other time when the presence is expected in the institution, except with the permission of the Warden / Deputy Warden based on genuine reason.
10. The inmates shall not stay away from Hall of Residence after working hours or on holidays without the permission of the Chief Warden/ Deputy Warden.
11. Day scholars are not permitted to enter the Hall of Residence.
12. Students shall be permitted to go out on outgoing day only with the permission of the Deputy Warden.
13. Visitors will be permitted inside Hall of Residence up to 6.30 pm for girls and 7.00 pm for boys, after obtaining proper prior permission from the Deputy Warden. If anyone is present after specified time without permission, action



will be taken against the boarder in whose room the person is found.

14. Audio system, computer and other electrical appliances shall be used only with prior permission of the warden. Terms and conditions for the use of such appliance will be stipulated from time to time. Audio & Video system including Walkman shall not be played after 8.30 pm.
15. The inmates should treat others as their fellow brothers irrespective of their caste, creed and religion. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. It is to be noted that ragging / hurting junior students by word or deed will attract punishment including expulsion from the hostel and the college.
16. Any student who is expelled from the college will automatically cease to be an inmate of the students' residence forthwith.

### Instructions

1. Keep the room doors open during the study hours.
2. Group study is not encouraged during the study hours.
3. Room once allotted will not be changed on any account. Students should not change the rooms themselves.
4. Outdoor games like cricket, volleyball etc., are not encouraged inside Hall of Residence building.
5. Any matter not covered by the above rules be decided by the chief Warden in consultation with the Chairman. The chief warden is vested with full powers to expel a student from the students' residence, if his/her presence is considered detrimental to the conducive atmosphere of the Hall of Residence / Institution. Before taking this action he will get the prior permission of the chairman.
6. In case of any complaints regarding housekeeping, register it in the notebook available with the residential warden.
7. Students not obeying the above rules will be immediately expelled from the Hall of Residence. No refund request will be entertained.

**Broadly Speaking Ragging is:**

1. Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, or handling with rudeness any other student, in rowdy or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique of a fresher or a junior students.
2. Ragging is banned in the institution and anyone indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately which punishment may include expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. The punishment may also take the shape of: (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits (ii) debarring from representation in events (iii) withholding results or (iv) expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
3. The college constitutes a proctorial committee consisting of senior faculty members and hostel authorities like wardens.
  - (i) To keep a continuous watch and vigil over ragging so as to prevent its occurrence and recurrence.
  - (ii) To promptly deal with the incidents of ragging brought to its notice and summarily punish the guilty either by itself or by putting-forth its findings / recommendations/ suggestions before the authority competent to take decision. All vulnerable locations shall be identified and specially watched.
